Minnesota AIDS Project - Services for Drug Users

Syringe Exchange

MAP operates a mobile syringe exchange program using a refurbished ambulance converted to conduct outreach and harm reduction services. Harm reduction services include syringe exchange for injection drug users, HIV testing, access to HIV prevention and care services, and referrals to services for basic needs. MAP has operated this service for a number of years but recently expanded when Access Works closed. The mobile service operates at fixed sites where the van is parked for specific time frames and by appointment when clients are unable to reach a fixed site. Pharmacy Access

Pharmacists in Minnesota can sell up to ten syringes to customers who do not have a prescription. Many pharmacies participate in the pharmacy access program but they are not required to. The MAP website (<http://www.mnaidsproject.org/living/systems/idu/syringeaccllocations.htm>) has a partial list of pharmacies in the metro area that are willing to sell syringes without a prescription. It is also legal in Minnesota to possess up to ten clean unused syringes.

HIV Testing

MAP offers HIV counseling, testing and referral during outreach and syringe exchange. The test gives a preliminary result in ten minutes using blood drawn from a finger stick. Clients may test anonymously and receive an individualized risk assessment including risk reduction strategies based on their risks.

HIV Care Outreach

Individuals living with HIV can meet with program staff to assess their need for HIV medical care and support services. The service is targeted to clients who aren't in care, need to re-connect to care services, or who are at risk of dropping out of care. Program staff help address client and system barriers that keep the client from fully accessing available services.

Twin Cities HOPE (Health through Outreach and Prevention Education)

Twin Cities HOPE is a collaboration between the Minnesota AIDS Project and Recovery Resource Center (RRC) substance abuse prevention program to address HIV, HCV (hepatitis C), and substance abuse. Monthly health fairs on the third Tuesday of each month offer HIV and hepatitis education, the TwinRX vaccine for hepatitis A and B, HIV testing, and HCV testing. Program staff also offer an eight session group intervention for active and former drug users at treatment centers, homeless shelters, and other programs targeting individuals with drug using histories.

Crystal Tuesday

Crystal Tuesday is a group intervention for men who have sex with men and use crystal meth. It meets every Tuesday at the Minnesota AIDS Project. It is open to both active and former meth users.

Rule 25 Chemical Health Assessments

MAP offers Rule 25 chemical health assessments for substance abuse treatment for individuals living with HIV.

Health services listed in this brochure are provided at no out-of-pocket cost and paid through Student Life fees (*unless otherwise noted*). Your MCTC photo Student I.D. must be presented at each visit.

If you have health insurance, please bring your insurance card with you. You do not need health insurance to access services covered by the Student Life fee, but additional services may be needed that are not covered by the Student Life fee.

The MCTC Student Life fee covers services obtained on the MCTC campus only. The MCTC Student Life fee does not cover services obtained at any other Boynton Health Service location.

Services

"Quick Clinic" Services

No appointment necessary. Visits last approximately 10 minutes. Service is provided on a first come, first served basis.

Common Illnesses:

- Cold/Cough
- Ear Infection
- Pink Eye
- Respiratory Flu
- Seasonal Allergies
- Sinus Infection
- Sore Throat
- Athlete's Foot
- Bug Bites
- Cold Sores
- Eczema
- Minor Sunburn
- Poison Ivy
- Ringworm
- Warts (three or fewer, non-genital)
- Bladder Infection or Urinary Tract Infection (do not take "Uristat" before visit)

Vaccines:

- Tetanus Vaccine (Td and Tdap)

Tests:

- Strep test
- Mono test
- Pregnancy test
- Rapid influenza test (seasonal)
- Urinary tract infection test (do not take "Uristat" before visit)

Primary Care Services

Call 612-625-3222 to make an appointment.

- Routine preventive health medical exams (i.e., physical exams, pelvic examinations, pap smears, contraception evaluation)
- Acute care for minor injuries and illnesses
- Orthopedic injury assessment
- Vaccinations and immunizations*
- Pharmaceutical prescriptions*
- Common medical supplies (bandages, ace wraps)
- Durable medical equipment supplied at cost to patients (i.e., crutches, splints, air casts)*
